As you are aware, the administration of STF has been working hard on planning and being prepared for the upcoming school year? While we are not able to announce any finalized plans, we have begun instituting some new protocols to help create a SAFE environment for students and staff. After careful research and consideration, the STF Buildings and Grounds has recommended and approved the application of MicroShield360 for both the church and school building.

MicroShield360 is an antimicrobial coating that prevents microorganisms from living on treated surfaces. This is a two-step process, and the first piece of the process does eradicate the virus that causes COVID19. The attached document provides more detail on the product and process.

We are very excited to be the first church and school in the State of Michigan to provide this extra level of protection. We anticipate the church application in the next two weeks, and the school building in prior to the beginning of the school year. MicroShield360 will increase the safety of all who come on our campus.
